

'SUSTAINABLE PATHWAYS TO A FUTURE' SCHOLARSHIP

School Scholarship Guidelines

'Sustainable Pathways to a Future' scholarships, provided by 'Women with a Mission' allow displaced Burmese Students to continue higher education. The scholarships are aimed to assist them complete their educational goals, meet their professional objectives and help them succeed to their fullest ability.

The scholarships will focus on students from Grade 9-12.

WHAT QUALIFIES STUDENTS TO A SCHOLARSHIP

APPLICATION AND SELECTION PROCESS

March	WWM will post on FB
March - May	<ul style="list-style-type: none">Completed application form sent to WWMStudent Interviews (online and when possible in person)Letter of reference (if possible)
Mid May (before school reopens)	WWM will confirm scholarship awards to selected students. Students to respond they accept scholarship.
	WWM will coordinate with school for payment of school fees.

GENERAL GUIDELINES

1. It is not guaranteed that the student who is awarded a scholarship for one year is automatically entitled to scholarship for the next year. This criteria for a scholarship award will remain the same every year.
2. Our scholarships will be limited to schools recognised by the Women With a Mission committee.
3. Students need to either reside at the school boarding house or with a immediate family to comply with Child Protection rules.
4. Students in the scholarship program will be expected to have 100% attendance except in case of medical reasons supported by a doctor's certificate for more than 3 days absence.
5. Students in the scholarship program are expected to adhere to the behavioural standards set by the school and local authorities.
6. Representatives from WWM will meet the children every quarter to understand progress and update sponsors. Attempts will be made to get regular reports from the school.
7. WWM will pay the school costs directly to the school. Proper receipts will be required from the schools and these will be maintained by WWM.
8. WWM may consider helping these children gain confidence by continuing the English Learning program or running English Camps with the assistance the attending school/s.
9. In case a student has left the school, there will be no tuitions costs paid for this student.
